The School is currently seeking to fill a Visiting Lecturer position for a one-year, full-time appointment starting on or shortly after August 15, 2019. The likely teaching duties include a required undergraduate course in statics and mechanics of materials and electives in fluid mechanics, finite element analysis, or spacecraft technology. Candidates are sought who have a Ph.D. degree in Mechanical Engineering, Aerospace Engineering, or a related discipline. Experience in instruction at the University level and the ability to teach a variety of classes, especially in fluid/thermal sciences and/or solid mechanics, are preferred. While applicants at the level of Lecturer are preferred, appointments at the Senior Lecturer level will be considered. Salary and rank will be commensurate with qualifications and experience, and the position includes benefits. This is a one-year, term appointment, without tenure; the appointment may be renewed for up to a total of three years after performance review by the Associate Director and dependent upon continued need by the department and the availability of funding.
